YOUR PAST MSA PRESIDENT

Dear Students,

My name is Pedro, and I was the Mohawk Students' Association President from 2024 to 2025 and will be returning for a second and final term from 2025 to 2026. Your MSA Board of Directors has made significant changes over the past year, building on the foundation laid by the students who came before us.

We have streamlined Federal advocacy efforts by joining the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA) as full-time members and on the Municipal level we have submitted pre-budget-recommendations and are exploring ongoing opportunities with the City of Hamilton and McMaster Students' Union. We had a successful election season, having restructured our Board to ensure more competency-based vetting systems for candidates by introducing three new roles: Board Chair, Director of External Affairs, and Director of College Affairs. We have also strengthened our relationship with the college; approved the budget for the new fiscal year, offsetting the deficit caused by lower admission rates; attended CASA's Advocacy Week in Ottawa, including a townhall featuring IRCC Marc Miller as the speaker; and hired the Board Chair for the upcoming term.

The MSA Impact Report serves as a guide to highlight our achievements throughout the year and provide our members with insight into the road ahead. It includes a comprehensive breakdown of the 2024 to 2025 fiscal year that explains how we made it all possible for you, the students.

How we achieved this priority last year:

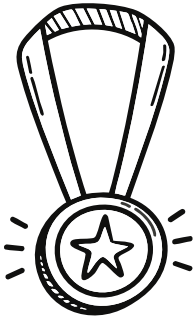
- Ensured that we enhanced cultural and identity-based events within our offerings, as well partnering with other areas of the college

Objectives:

1. Recruitment: Ensure healthy turnout for elections, AMM, student reps, Board Positions, and student staff.

How we achieved this priority last year:

- Student Leads gained a seat at the table, contributing to decision-making around events, clubs, services, and community offerings
- Empowered clubs and communities' leaders through hosting their own events
- Collaborated with Mohawk College's Business Accounting Program and the Financial Assistance Department to offer complimentary tax services to students during tax season

Humanizing the Brand

How we achieved this priority last year:

- Began offering Monthly Birthday Celebrations to students throughout the fall and winter semesters

- Prioritized highlighting MSA members through graphics, videos, photos, and blogs

- Collaborated with Mohawk College Athletics to host the first-ever MSA Night at the David Braley Athletics Centre (DBARC) on Fennell Campus
- Increased visibility at other campuses and partner locations including triOS, Six Nations Polytechnic, Wentworth Heights and Tansley Woods

Establishing MSA Work Culture

THE ELECTION OF YOUR MSA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

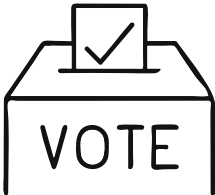

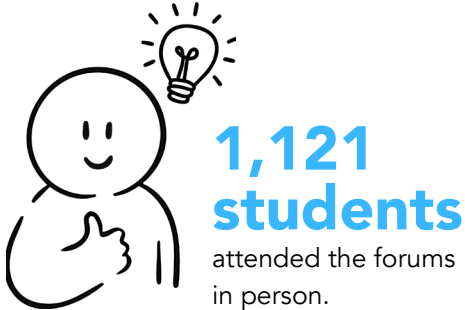

Dialogue: Conversations

Conversations provide MSA members (full-time students who pay fees and have yet to opt out of their health and dental insurance plan) access to counselling until remission without paying out-of-pocket fees, facing long wait lists, and having to submit insurance claims.

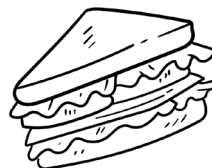

THE MSA STUDENT EXPERIENCE FUND

We know that gaining relevant, real-world, hands-on experience while in college can be financially challenging for many students. So, we implemented The MSA Student Experience Fund to help alleviate some of the costs related to your academic and overall college journey.

Last fall, a group of nine students from Mohawk's Paralegal program received \$1,590 from The MSA Student Experience Fund to visit Parliament in Ottawa.

According to Emily Nicol, one of the trip organizers, many students wouldn't have been able to afford travel or accommodations without the MSA's support.

"The trip was a huge success!" Nicol said. "We took a tour of the Supreme Court of Canada and bonded while visiting Parliament together."

Hannah Toope says The MSA Student Experience Fund allowed her and many other students in Mohawk's Graphic Design Program to attend The Graphics Canada Show. Without the support of The MSA Student Experience Fund, Toope says they wouldn't have been able to afford the bus to the event.

"I learned so much and spoke with so many industry professionals and business people," Toope said. "I truly hope future students can experience this field trip – it felt like a reward after completing a work-heavy school year."

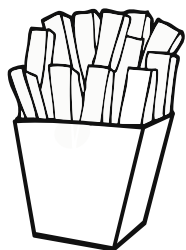

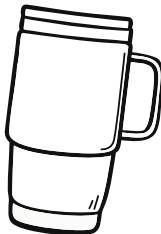

SERVING SUSTAINABILITY, ONE CONTAINER AT A TIME

We wanted to minimize our plastic waste and do our part to leave the world a little greener than when we found it. From 2024 to 2025, we phased out single-use plastic containers and cutlery in favour of reusable Friendlier plastic containers at all Hospitality outlets in The MSA Student Centre and offered students a \$0.25 discount when they used their own coffee mug at Brewed Awakenings.

THE CELLAR: YOUR PUB ON CAMPUS

We relaunched The Cellar in September 2024, expanding operations to five days a week to create more opportunities for students to connect, relax, and unwind on campus. FINANCIAL REPORT

The MSA is a separate, non-profit organization within Mohawk College—built for students, by students. Each year, your student fees help fund our operations and ensure we can continue providing crucial resources to students across all campuses.



MSA COMPULSORY ANCILLARY FEES (2024 TO 2025)

Students pay compulsory fees in addition to tuition every semester. These mandatory fees help support essential services and programs that enhance the experience for all students across Mohawk College.

MSA RESERVE FUNDS

The MSA maintains two reserve funds to ensure that we can continue offering services and support to students with minimal interruption in case of an emergency. The Internally Restricted Funds (see Note 11) \$2,221,201, is comprised of two parts: \$2,000,000 was established to provide funds in the event of a significant shortfall in operating revenues, and the other \$221,201 is allocated to the Health & Dental Plan. Unrestricted Funds are considered all other cash holdings that are not internally restricted.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

The MSA made several capital improvements this year throughout the Student Centre, including the addition of new furniture. We also redesigned The MSA Boardroom, installed a new draught system in The Cellar, implemented a new point of sales system, and created a new microwave station for students to re-heat their meals on campus!

The MSA remains dedicated to revitalizing our spaces whether by making enhancements to existing spaces or creating new ones. 15% of the Programs, Services & Student Government Fee paid by students is allocated for this purpose.

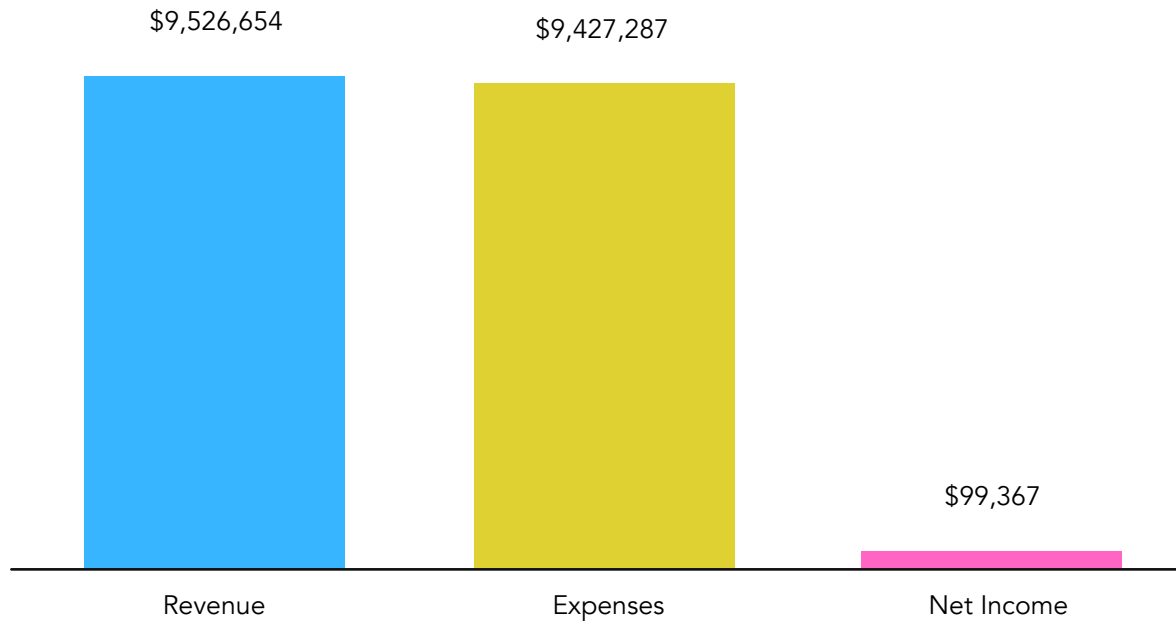
Total Capital Expenditures (2024 to 2025)

Capital expenditures during 2024–2025 included \$283,339 for Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment and \$121,393 for Leasehold Improvements, totaling \$404,732. Of the equipment purchased, \$40,944 was later identified as obsolete or impaired and subsequently disposed of, with some assets donated to the College.



SUMMARY

The MSA received \$9,526,654 in total revenue for the year, less total expenses of \$9,427,287 resulting in a total net income of \$99,367.
